Cover Art

Move over X-men and Avengers, and make way for the Superheroes of the Sacrament pictured in today's cover art, in which Peter Paul Rubens incorporates figures from church history into a dramatic spectacle. On the far right side, dressed in cardinal's robes, is St. Jerome, whose taking of the sacrament of the Eucharist at his last rites was a favourite subject in painting. The book Jerome reads is his translation of the Bible into Latin. In front of Jerome in a white monastic habit and four-cornered hat is Norbert, the German bishop-saint. He carries the sacrament of the Eucharist bundled beneath his robes. In the centre stands St. Thomas Aquinas in his Dominican habit, holding a book of his writings and pointing heavenward, thereby reinforcing the role of these holy heroes as proclaimers and defenders of Christian doctrine. Hymns of adoration composed by the Angelic Doctor are sung whenever the Blessed Sacrament is venerated, and are included in today's celebrations. Next to St. Thomas is St. Clare, dressed in the Franciscan habit of the Poor Clares and holding a great monstrance. To the left of St. Clare is St. Gregory the Great, shown wearing his papal robes and tiara and holding the papal staff. Gregory authored some of the most important texts of the Church, including most of the Canon and prayers of the Mass. Next to him is the bishop-saint Ambrose, an influential shaper of Church doctrine who is best known for asserting the dogma of Divine Presence in the Eucharist. At far left and recognizable by his black beard, crosier and mitre is St. Augustine. His writings on the Trinity explained various aspects of the sacrament of the Eucharist.

Music of the Mass

The *Missa Pange lingua* is an extended fantasia on the *Pange Lingua* hymn, and is one of Josquin's most famous mass settings. The hymn on which the mass is based is the famous *Pange Lingua Gloriosi*, by Thomas Aquinas, which is used for the Vespers of Corpus Christi, and which is also sung during the veneration of the Blessed Sacrament.

A number of attempts have been made to discern the meaning behind the mysterious *Corpus Christi Carol*, with some regarding it as an allusion to the Grail legend, or to Anne Boleyn, whose family symbol/badge was the falcon. The most plausible reading of the 14/15th century carol is as an allegory of Our Lord whose wounds bleed in perpetuity for humanity, whilst the maid at His bedside is the Blessed Virgin. Benjamin Britten's haunting setting was most recently popularized by Jeff Buckley, and the text has been set to music by a number of other contemporary composers.

Church of St Barnabas A&M Financial Report - June 2019

This is a brief summary of our current financial situation - a follow-up to the special vestry meeting held last Sunday 16 June. The decision to hold this meeting was made at our Annual Vestry Meeting in February, where the substantial deficit incurred by our Parish in 2018 was the main topic of discussion.

As of 31 May 2019:

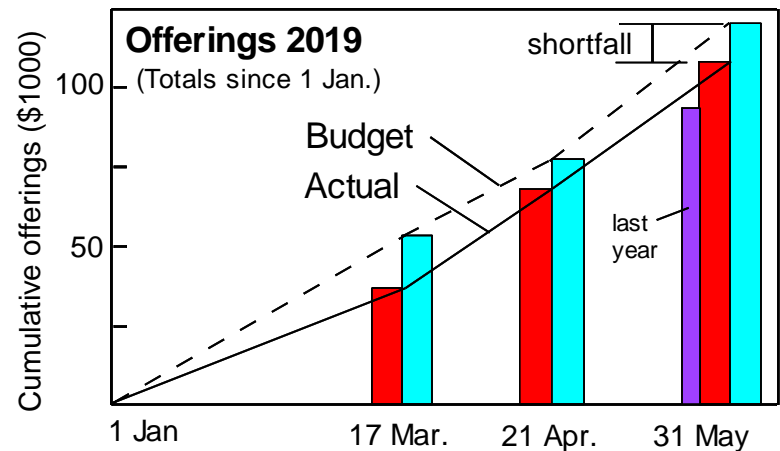
Expenses: are right on budget, despite the increased fuel bills from an exceptionally long and hard winter.

Income Sources: Donations amount to 85% of our budgeted income. Most of this is regular weekly offerings from parishioners.

Offerings: have increased from \$93 500 at this time last year to \$108 500, an increase of 16%. A big thank you to all of you who have increased your support to your Parish by increasing your givings and/or going on PAR (pre-authorized remittance)! **BUT...**

Deficit: our shortfall in givings has decreased substantially, as the graph on the next page shows. **However, we still have an income shortfall of about \$11 700.** If we do not make this up, and continue with this level of givings, our deficit at year end will be around \$25 000. This is much better than last year's deficit, but it is still a deficit.

If we continue to run annual deficits at this rate, we shall run out of money in 8 - 10 years.
